



UPDATES TO THE EXECUTIVE ORDER PERTAINING TO MAINE'S COVID-19 RESPONSE STARTING JUNE 1ST, 2020:

GATHERINGS: The number of people who can gather with social distancing has increased from 10 to 50 people.

DINING ESTABLISHMENTS: In Androscoggin, Cumberland, and York Counties, dining establishments may open for to-go and outdoor dining only.

STAY SAFER AT HOME: Unless you are accessing essential services, it is still considered safer to stay where you are living vs. spending time in public. This is especially true for those who are at higher risk for complications related to COVID-19.

MORE BUSINESS INFORMATION: When possible, businesses should be operating remotely. When this is not practical, all open businesses must adhere to guidance from the State of Maine and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

TRAVEL: Public transportation should still only be utilized for essential travel. Passengers in private vehicles should still be limited to household members. Guidelines recommending a 14 day self-quarantine after out of state travel remain in place but are under review.

FACE COVERINGS (MASKS): Masks should be worn at all public gatherings, including those outdoors. Businesses may also refuse entry or service to those not wearing masks appropriately (covering face/nose). Limited medical conditions and age guidelines exempt individuals from this requirement.
